# Hotel Les Roches Rouges Ile d'Or, France

Sitting pretty on the edge of L'Esterel National Park, the Hotel Les Roches Rouges is a waterfront property of azure blue, white and ochre red colours where barefoot luxury is celebrated on the rocks of the Riviera.

Drinks can be enjoyed from private balconies overlooking the waters. A visit to the spa. where staff pamper guests with Polynesian massages and mineral scrubs, is a must. There are two pools, a Mediterranean garden, three bars, two restaurants and an array of activities, from open-air cinema to diving, yoga, hiking, cookery, sailing and fishing

#### The Idle Rocks St Mawes, Cornwall

The white Edwardian building sits on the harbourfront at St Mawes, with views from the terrace across the Fal estuary to St Anthony Head at the southernmost tip of the Roseland Peninsula. The property was transformed in 2013 and has been part of the Relais & Châteaux collection since 2016.

The restaurant, under head chef Guy Owen, has entered into a soil-to-plate partnership with the 200-acre Lost Gardens of Heligan estate to showcase Cornish produce, including more than 300 varieties of fruit and vegetables and rare-breed livestock, making it a foodie hotspot. Owen fuses local produce with Asian, North African and French influences from his training at Claridge's and La Trompette in Chiswick.

Macakizi Bodrum, Turkey

Turkey's chic boutique hotel offers HNWs elegant pastel rooms to contrast with the colourful landscapes of Bodrum peninsula. Maçakizi (pronounced 'magicizzy') comprises 74 rooms, including 21 suites featuring sculpted wooden furniture, textured canvases and dazzling views of the Aegean Sea.

Head chef Aret Sahakvan will impress even the pickiest diner with his array of traditional and 'new Turkish' delicacies, from tiny dumplings to spiced lahmacun (pizza). Wine lovers will enjoy the cellar, which is stocked with hundreds of varieties, including local boutique labels. Staff are generous with it too. 'Before you've had time to notice your glass is empty, an unseen hand has swiftly refilled it, the Telegraph wrote.

### Malliouhana Anguilla, Caribbean
